St. Margaret's Episcopal School is an independent, coeducational, college preparatory day school serving students in preschool through grade twelve. Approximately 30% of students in the Upper School are students of color. St. Margaret's students come from 33 communities in central, southern and coastal Orange County. Within a community framework that emphasizes teamwork, mutual respect, service and commitment to the common good, we teach and seek a diverse environment that respects individual differences and acknowledges the dignity of each individual.

There are 425 students enrolled in Upper School for the 2011-2012 academic year. The student/faculty ratio is 12:1. Seventy-five percent of the Upper School faculty hold an advanced degree.
